Take the Pantano road (via Antognola) to the Raccordo (Bettolle - Perugia), take Magione exit and head towards Magione, follow signs to Chiusi via Sant' Arcangelo (SR599), then SR142 to Chiusi.

Museo della Cattedrale, Labirinto di Porsenna e Torre di San Secondiano, tickets Euro 8 per person Euro 4 for concessions, cash only!! Tour length approx 40 minutes.

Guided tour of the underground passages leading the Etruscan water gathering system heavily modified by the Romans. Followed by the opportunity to climb to the top of the bell tower to gain wonderful 360 degree panoramic views.



Ristorante Bar Il Bucchero - reasonably priced restaurant with a lovely shaded garden. Serving pizza at lunchtime with a good selection of pasta dishes.



Anghiari 45 mins



Take the E45(SS3bis) north as far as Citta di Castello, then follow SS221 towards Arezzo, just after Monterchi take the SP42, then SS73 and finally the SP47 to Anghiari.

En route to Anghiari - Convento Eremo di Montecasale - 15mins outside of Sansepolco, Monastery dating back to 1192 set in woodland with walking trails and waterfalls. Wonderful far reaching views and a place for quiet contemplation.

Museo della Battaglia e di Anghiari - small museum dedicated to the history of the battle of Anghiari in 1440 and the lost painting of the battle by Leonardo da Vinci. Entry 4 euros.

Deruta 35 mins



Take the E45(SS3bis) South then after 39km take the exit Deruta Centro, turn left onto Via alle Barche. At the roundabout take 1st exit onto Via alle Barche SP419.

Browse the many small hand painted maiolica ware galleries clustered around the charming little piazza with the fountain at its centre.

Chiesa di San Francesco - beautiful little church just off the main piazza, some lovely original ceramic altar pieces and other elements.

Visit the Museo Regionale della Ceramica di Deruta - history and technical background of the production of hand painted maiolica ware typical to the area. Entry 9 euros.

Giardino Panoramico - wonderful panoramic views from the quiet little park with ceramic benches based around a central fountain.

Situated at 648 meters in the municipality of Foligno, this picturesque hamlet is famous for its, restored watermills, historic, and, peaceful atmosphere.

Todi 55 mins

Known for its well-preserved medieval, Roman, and Etruscan, structures, it features the stunning Piazza del Popolo, the Duomo di Todi, and panoramic views of the surrounding countryside.
